

You could be admitting to being a creature of statute depending on how you sign the driver license or passport application. If you sign it correctly (just like any other government document if you don't want the benefits and privileges and you want to reserve your rights which are superior) of course you write it By: signature put your name under the signature in title case (John Henry Doe) and then 'All rights reserved' under that, and that will get copied onto the passport now. By: means by accommodation and the signature beside it is evidence of a living wo/man and is a different party to the legal name under it and only the living have 'All rights' to reserve so you're creating now a position of diversity; two parties on this passport. So you are no longer now the creature of statute, so you're free!

"What if they won't let me do that?" and I've told them every single time what to do and every single one of them has walked out with their all rights reserve license. If they question you, just ask another question eg they say "Why do you want this?" and you can say "Well am I not entitled to protect my rights?" they are thinking 'what's this all rights reserved on the application/' they don't like it. You can also say "I need a copy of that application for my business records" Why would I want that? That's evidence just in case they try to renege. On holding position; people are afraid to hold their position, they get an offer and they think they have to do it when it is only an offer. eg 'You can't do that!' "Oh ok". That's acceptance of the offer and now you have accepted that you can't do it. If you ask for a copy and tell them it is for your business records they will say "yeah sure we'll give you one"

With the passport they said "You can't do this!!" and I said "but but but i just did" "No no we won't accept it" and I said "Well are you telling me you have authority to tell me how I sign my signature?" and they said "Have you got evidence that that is your usual signature?". Don't go into battle (apply for things in the public) unless you're prepared. I was prepared! I threw on the table several cards, bank cards, social security card all of them with 'All rights reserved' on the back of them as part of the signature. They said "Oh in your case we have to". Of course!

You have to have paid for it and if they don't give you the benefit you paid for with the payment that's a breach of contract. I'll sue them, I know how to sue.

Only a living man can sign 'All rights reserved' but you are using the strawman in the signature as a transmitting utility to operate in the public. The 'All rights reserved' signature allows you to establish that you are only agreeing to what is directly on the paper in front of you and they cannot attach additional terms and conditions to it later eg in the license process with the All rights reserved signature you are agreeing to

use and possession rights of the document without the all rights signature, they can attach the road rules to the document, with the all rights reserved signature it makes it clear that anything else has NOT been agreed to and so there is no longer any implied consent in place.

Hi when I went in to get it in NZ I prayed first for strength and peace. I had to calmly hold my position and help them remain calm. They did a lot to try to stop me such as ringing higher authorities and getting the manager, but I just kept calmly stating what I needed and in the end I got the result I wanted. I was gutted to discover my signature hadn't come out right and I had to go in again. I took full responsibility for the mistake and I paid for my license again. The second time I was served by an angel who helped ensure everything was done correctly that time.

My partner and I did the Stat Dec and got it signed by the JP. We took it with us to get the new licences in Brisbane and we told them we had lost the licence. Well I actually did. We did not tell them or ask them about putting, All Rights Reserved, in with our signature we just asked if we could get new pictures taken as we have aged a little and when it came Time to sign we just signed our names, By: xxxxxx and under that all rights reserved remembering to make sure some letters touch the signature above incase they try to cut it out. It was that simple and we asked for printed copies of the paper work. But we did rehearse what to say if they said no. But they can't its my signature and I can sign it anyway I like as far as I am concerned.

Updating my license. I updated my licence details to a c/- address and my autograph on an electronic pad that 'crashed' 3 times when the girl tried to save it. It was nearly closing time so they were keen to finish the transaction. I have a record and they know I'll be back if it's not correct. See what arrives.!

Another thing that will help to make sure your signature is accepted is to join each line together. If you separate each line the computer may read it as an error and require you to do your signature again, as happened to me. I surmised that the computer read it as incorrect because there were three lines of text. When I went in and redid it they told me the computer rejected it, so I made sure I joined all three lines together on the second try and this time it was accepted.
